Founder of the Sugarschool on Java.

1918 Retiring, he made a world journey via Japan, Hawaii and the U.S.A.
(San Francisco and New York) while keeping lectures on Java Sugar.

1919-1949 Adviser to Dutch East-Indies agricultural institutions at
's-Gravenhage like Soemobito.

Co-operating with Het Algemeen Financieel Dagblad. (a paper).

1945-1968 Advisor on taxes.

1950-1960 Teacher of the Spanish language.

Supporter of the first movement and the ideas of Robert Schumann
for a United Europe. Studied Portuguese and Esperanto.

1955 In contact with Prime Minister David Ben Goerion of Israel about
the lifting of the ex-communication of Baruch d'Espinoza,
(Spinoza), (1632-1677), whose works he had studied. As a result a
black stone was placed by the Ambassador of the State of Israel

behind the Nieuwe Kerk (New Church) in The Hague with the inscription, in Hebrew "your people".
