

**EXTRACT, OF, MATRICULATION, OF, THE, ARMS, OF, MAJOR  
 PETER, FREDERIC, SHOLTO, DOUGLAS, OF, GIMONDE, UQUVUKWES,**

**P**ETER FREDERIC SHOLTO DOUGLAS OF GIMONDE UQUVUKWES in Southern Rhodesia, -  
 Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Holder of King Haakon VII of Norway's Freedom Cross, -  
 Major, late 8th Battalion, Otago and Southland Rifles, having by Petition unto the Lord Lyon King -  
 of Arms of date 30 September 1901 **SEWEN; STAS** he, the Petitioner, born 23 August 1910 at Dalmahoy -  
 in Midlothian (who married 6 June 1942 Teresa Somer, younger daughter of the late Henry Somers Rivers, J.P.) is the  
 third son of the Honorable Archibald Rodrick Sholt Douglas (retired Lieutenant, R.N.V.R., sometime of 1st Lovat -  
 Scouts), and his wife (married 22 October 1907 at Buryhough-on-the-Hill, Melton Mowbray) Winona Constance de Marquisville,

daughter of Colonel Walter Peake, D.S.O., of Melton Mowbray; **STAS** the Petitioner's father, the said Honorable  
 Archibald Rodrick Sholt Douglas, born 11 September 1851 was the third son of the Right Honorable Sholto George  
 Watson Douglas, 19th Earl of Morton, Lord Aberdeen, Dalkeith and Douglas of Lochleven, a Representative Peer for  
 Scotland 1886 - 1935, Deputy Lieutenant for the County of Otago, and in the Commission of the Peace for the Counties  
 of Otago and Midlothian, and his wife (married 25 Aug 1877 at London) The Honorable Helen Gertrude Maria,  
 daughter of Charles Frederick Penrose, 2nd Baron of Penrose, and Baron of Walsley; **STAS** Arms were recorded in the Public Register  
 of All Arms and Bearings in Scotland (Vol. 1, Folio 52) circa 1672 in name of William Douglas, 9th Earl of Morton, -  
 Lord Dalkeith who was in direct descent from William de Douglas (founded 1175) progenitor of the House of -



Douglas; **AND** the Petitioner having prayed that the foresaid Ensigns Demoral might be matriculated of new in the said Public  
 Register in his own name with his due and congruent difference the Lord Lyon King of Arms by Interlocutor of date 6 November  
 1902 granted warrant to the Lyon Clerk to matriculate in the Public Register of All Arms and Bearings in Scotland in name of -  
 the Petitioner the following Ensigns Demoral, videlicet: - Quarterly: 1st and 4th, Argent, a man's heart gules assigned  
 of an Imperial Crown proper, on a chief Azure three mullets of the First; 2nd and 3rd, Argent, three piles issuant gules, the  
 exterior charged in chief with a mullet of the First all within a border inverted Vert, Above the Shield is placed an Helm - - -  
 bearing his degree, with a Mantling Gules doubled Argent, and on a Wreath of the Livories is set for Crest a sanguier Vert sticking between two chiefs of an oak-leaf proper  
 fected of the First, a chain and lock Azure holding the two chiefs together, and in an Escrol over the same this motto LOCKED - SICKER. - - -  
 Matriculated the 30th day of April 1903. - - - Extracted from the 134th Page of the 5th Volume of the Public Register of All Arms and Bearings in Scotland -  
 this First day of May, One Thousand, Nine Hundred and Sixty-three. - - -
